

Openness

- ≻Collaboration that enriches the process to develop better content
- > An open system in which participation is expanded to include a wide and relevant audience
- Participation without discrimination must be available at every stage of the standards development process
- SMMEs must be given meaningful opportunities to participate





Impartiality And Consensus

Impartiality

Decisions that are based on objective criteria rather than on the basis of bias, prejudice, or conferring the benefit to one organization over another for whatever reasons

Consensus

General agreement

Absence of sustained opposition to substantive issues by any

- important part of the concerned interests
- Seeking to take into account views of all parties concerned





STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

Necessity to involve players that may be materially affected by the standard's implementation *i.e Industry, government, consumers, NGOs*
